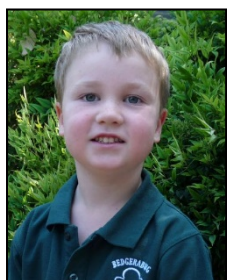

School Display @ the Bbong Show

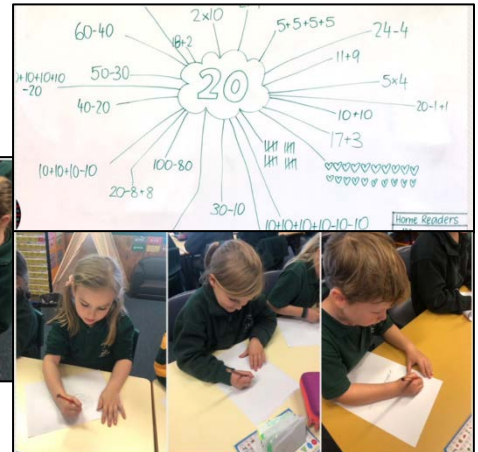

Fried chicken stewed in soy sauce

KARI AYAM JAMUR – CHICKEN CURRY NOODLES

Bahan-bahan: Ingredients: 200 gr mie/egg noodles or rice noodles, 1 tbsp oil, 3 cloves garlic, 2 red onions, 500 ml chicken stock, 1 tbsp curry powder, 1 tsp turmeric, 1/2 leek 50 gr mushrooms, 25 gr basil, 200 gr chicken fillet, chopped into small pieces, salt, pepper
Cara membuat: Preparation/method: Boil the noodles in water and then drain. Slice the garlic and the onions fine. Slice the leek julienne. Heat the oil in a wok and fry the garlic and the onions for 3 minutes. Add the stock and the chicken and cook it until done. Add the curry, the turmeric, the mushrooms, the leek, the basil, the salt and the pepper.

Mix the noodles into the chicken mix. Serve

Beef Chow Mein

1 tbs vegetable oil, 2 medium brown onion, chopped, 2 garlic cloves, crushed, 1kg beef mince, 2 carrot, peeled, halved, thinly sliced, 2 cups frozen peas, 1 chinese cabbage, shred finely, 750ml chicken stock, 3 tbs curry powder, 4 tbs tomato sauce, 4 tbs soy sauce, 1 pkt chicken noodle soup mix, 6 tbs uncooked rice.

Method

Heat oil in a frying pan over medium-high heat. Add onion and garlic. Cook, stirring, for 3 minutes or until onion has softened. Add mince. Cook, stirring with a wooden spoon to break up mince, for 8 to 10 minutes or until browned and cooked through. Add curry, tomato sauce, soy sauce and chicken noodle soup mix. Stir through. Add carrot. Cook, stirring for 5 minutes or until carrot starts to soften. Stir in stock. Season with pepper. Add cabbage, peas and rice. Bring to the boil. Reduce heat to medium-low. Simmer, stirring occasionally, for 10 minutes or until the rice is cooked. Serve.

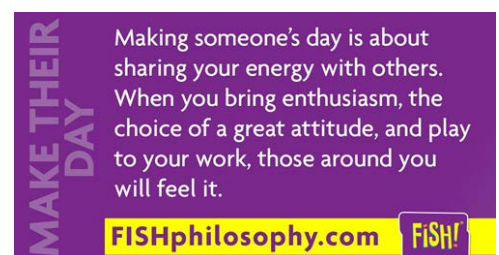
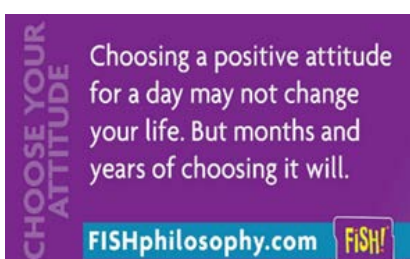
BEDGERABONG TENNIS CLUB
